DBP IS GOING TO NATIONALS!

The Dewey Beach Patrol (DBP) will be sending a group of 14 lifeguards, led by Team Captain Sr. Lieutenant Hank Coveleski, to the 2022 United States Lifesaving Association (USLA) Nationals Competition. The competition this year is held just outside Los Angeles, California at Hermosa Beach. This annual competition brings lifeguards from all over the country to one competition to compete against each other in varying events related to lifeguard activities. To qualify for this prestigious event, the DBP compete competed July 13th at the 2022 Mid-Atlantic Regionals in Rehoboth Beach. At this competition DBP placed first and 3rd in the Men's 4x100 sprint teams. Placing 1st Eid Nourha, CJ Fritchman, Mikey Frederick, Hank D'Ambrogi and placing 3rd Hunter Jones (Rookie of The Year), Sean Carson, Austin Rhue, John Antonio overall. The Men's Sprint Team has won two years in a row and are looking to make it a threepeat as well as gain two of the three podium spots. The Dewey Women's 4x100 sprint team made up of Elizabeth Melson, Hadley Rhue, Olivia Brozefsky, Elizabeth Rishko placed 4th overall and qualified. Dewey also had four lifeguards place in the Beach Flags competition: Eid Nourha & CJ Fritchman qualified in the Men's Open Beach Flags while Steve Hagen qualified in the Age Group 30-35 Men's Beach Flags. Elizabeth Rishko qualified in the Women's Beach Flags. These competitors will go to Hermosa Beach on August 10th to compete in the USLA Nationals Competition through August 13th and showcase the multiple talents of the Dewey Beach Lifeguards and the Town of Dewey on a National Level.

Squash 'em statewide: Invasive spotted lanternfly lands in Sussex; Delaware now fully quarantined

Invasive spotted lanternflies have hitchhiked to Sussex County, and they're not on summer vacation. Established populations of the destructive insect have been found in Georgetown, Milford, Seaford, Ocean View and Rehoboth, according to the Delaware Department of Agriculture. Homeowners are encouraged to do their part by educating themselves about the species and taking steps to eradicate them from their property, as well as using a checklist to confirm the bug is not present on or in your vehicle before moving it.
