DO I NEED A PERMIT IN THE TOWN OF DEWEY BEACH?

Yes. All construction including remodeling, repairs, demolition, additions to any building, structure or parcel requires a permit. Interior and exterior projects require permits.

Dewey Beach Code §71-3

Any person who may desire to erect, alter, repair, move, raze, or add to any building or other structure, including fences, bulkheads and retaining walls, within the Town, shall first apply to the Town for a building permit.

Dewey Beach Code §101-12

It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to begin construction or other development which is wholly within, partially within, or in contact with any identified special flood hazard area, as established in § 101-4, including but not limited to subdivision of land, filling, grading, or other site improvements and utility installations; construction, alteration, remodeling, improvement, replacement, reconstruction, repair, relocation, or expansion of any building or structure; placement or replacement of a manufactured home; recreational vehicles; installation or replacement of storage tanks; or alteration of any watercourse,

until a permit is obtained from the Town of Dewey Beach.

All Building Permits are 3% of the total cost of construction (materials & labor). The minimum Building Permit cost is \$50. Ordinance #757, 01/08/21.

In addition to the actual Building Permit cost, a Building Permit APPLICATION FEE is required when the project's total cost of construction is \$15,000 or more.

This non-refundable fee is payable at the time the Building Permit is submitted to the Town.

ARE BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED?

Yes. Dewey Beach Code §117-1

No person shall operate, maintain or otherwise be engaged in any business designated in the license fee schedule herein within the municipal boundary without first obtaining a license from the Town.

Including but not limited to the following:

ALL contractors, subcontractors, landscapers, cleaning agencies, a 'handyman' need to have a current Dewey Beach Business License and renewed yearly.

Everyone Deserves Safe Access to Beautiful Dewey Beach!

In 2017, the Town of Dewey Beach began our fundraising effort to install beach access mats on each dune entrance. AccessMat® Beach Accessibility Mats are an ABA/ADA compliant accessibility system that has been specifically developed for use in permanent or temporary recreation applications. AccessMat® is a portable and removable rollout access route that provides easy beach access for wheelchairs and strollers, but also makes entering the beach easier and safer for individuals of all abilities.

Our Adopt-A-Dune program allows individuals and organizations to sponsor a section of one of our beach access mats, and even personalize their own panel with a message, design, or logo of their choice. Please visit the town website to sponsor an access mat panel. The pricing for the panels is as follows:

- Full Panel Size (4 ft x 2 ft): \$1,000.00
- Half Panel Size (2 ft x 2 ft): \$500.00
- 1/4 Panel Size (2 ft x 1 ft): \$250.00

Your sponsorship guarantees placement of your ad panel for 3 years from date of installation. Installation time varies - designs will be submitted for production and printing, which may have a turnaround time of up to 4 weeks. As soon as the mat is delivered to Dewey Beach Town Hall, installation will be scheduled as soon as possible. Street availability is on a first come, first serve basis.
