Skimboarding is deeply rooted in the

Skimboarding is deeply rooted in the Dewey Beach culture.

The success and popularity of Dewey's skimboarding community can be largely credited to Harry Wilson, who started selling his own Sandpiper Skimboards in the mid 70's right here in Dewey. He's witnessed and participated in the evolution of not just the board itself, but the sport as a whole.

While skimboarding was starting to pick up speed in Hawaii and California, Wilson put Delaware on the map with his creation of the East Coast Skimboard Championships in 1982. He later formed Skim USA, which connected local skimboarders with the larger competition circuit happening on the west coast. While Skim USA has since changed hands, we have Wilson to thank for getting the Dewey skim wave rolling.

The culmination of the Skim USA tour each year, the Zap Pro/Am World
Championships of Skimboarding is where the top amateur skimboarders of the world gather to vie for a spot on the podium.

This year is the 43rd anniversary of the contest, which is a three-day event that has live music, great food, and an amazing skimboarding competition, all in the heart of the skimboarding capital of the East Coast, Dewey Beach!



Make a Plan



NOW IS THE TIME TO PREPARE FOR STORM SEASON

NOAA predicts a 60% chance of above normal activity this season. Here is your reminder to prepare now for potential severe storms.

The 2025 hurricane season typically spans from mid-August through mid-October. While the state of Delaware has been lucky in avoiding a direct hit from a major hurricane, we've seen that even smaller systems off of our coast can pose a severe threat. While high, solid dune structures protect us from rising ocean waters in many cases, bay side flooding is a major concern. If you've spent any length of time in Dewey, you know that even a solid rain storm combined with a lunar tide can have flood waters reaching

Dewey Beach property owners can schedule an appointment to assess their individual flood risk. Contact Building Official Daune Hinks today at (302)227-6363. Coastal Highway. Severe storm surge from hurricanes off the coast cause flash flooding throughout town. It is imperative that not just residents know the risks, but that property owners properly inform their renters who may not be well-versed in the price we pay to live in a coastal community. We encourage all members of the Dewey Beach family to register for the Delaware Emergency Notification (DENS), and also subscribe to our town emails to receive severe weather alerts. SEPTEMBER 20, 2025

Be Ready to Vote This Summer!

STEP 1 - REGISTER TO VOTE

Make sure you're registered to vote by checking the <u>registered voter list</u> posted on the town website. This list is updated periodically. Voter registration is open all year long, closing only during the 30 days prior to the election. If you are already registered, you do not need to register again. Those who wish to register to vote can fill out the voter registration form <u>here</u>. Only individuals who are at least 18 years of age and either bonafide residents, property owners, tenants, or trustees may register to vote. Applicants must meet the criteria outlined in the <u>Town Charter</u>.

STEP 2 - MEET THE COUNCIL

Do you know your local leaders? Read more about the Dewey Beach Town Commissioners here. Our elected officials are devoted individuals with a passion for public service. The best way to get to know your local government officials is to attend or watch the monthly Town Council meetings. View the town meeting calendar on the homepage of our website for upcoming meetings and topics up for discussion. Watch live meetings, or view the archive on our YouTube channel.

STEP 4 - MEET THE CANDIDATES

Eligible individuals who wish to file as a candidate for the 2025 election should complete the <u>form</u> on our website.

Once filings are received, candidates up for election will be posted on our website. Check back often! Registration continues through August 21st!

STEP 3 - STAY IN THE KNOW

Keep an eye on the <u>2025 Election</u>
<u>Calendar</u> for important dates! We'll also post election news on our <u>website</u>.

August 21st: Candidate filing and voter registration deadline.

August 22nd: Notice of Election*

August 25th: Absentee voting begins! Cast your vote at Town Hall during business hours, or <u>request a ballot by mail.</u>

September 19th: Absentee voting closes at noon.

September 20th: Election Day! Cast your vote at the Dewey Beach Lifesaving Station between 10:00am and 6:00pm.

*Three seats are up for election. If no more than three candidates file, there will be no commissioner election for 2025.


