

December is a month to spend some time with family and friends, reflect on the last year and look forward to the next!

As the cold weather has arrived in Dewey Beach, I want to remind folks to make sure you leave your heat on enough to keep those pipes from freezing (typically between 55°F and 60°F). Every winter we have homes in Dewey with water leaks due to burst pipes. Go to our town webpage and sign up for our Property Watch program in case we do need to contact you during the off season.

I want to thank everyone for your patience during the State's repaving project. The project should be completed by December 9th, depending on the weather. If you should have any questions about the paving, please contact Dustin Fisher at dustin.fisher@allanmyers.com or (610) 425-8071.

The Town will repaint all driveway markings this spring. Again, if you would like your driveway marking changed, please contact us.

Work on the new Town Hall continues to move forward with the interior walls and roof being constructed.

Work on the center island at RT I and Read Avenue from a recent car accident will start on December 8-9th depending on the weather.

A couple of reminders:

- If you have stopped your trash pick-up with Casella, the public trash cans are NOT for your household trash. Take your trash home!
- Please DO NOT plant or put anything in the town right-of-way without contacting the Town first. Items in the town right of way will be removed.



SAFETY & REGULATIONS

The goal of town staff is to welcome all of our visitors, protect the public, and ensure safe travel back to their destination at the end of the evening. Safety is a shared responsibility.

- Start 2026 off right! Have a travel plan, and stick to it. At the time of publishing, rideshare promo codes have not
 yet been released. We recommend keeping an eye on <u>Lyft</u> and <u>Uber</u>, as NYE promo codes are sometimes
 offered. Don't forget you can schedule ahead with rideshare companies. Reserve your ride today.
- Local hotels and residential rentals have great rates in the off-season. Don't drive... stay with us! There's nothing better than waking up at the beach.
- Dewey Beach maintains a <u>curfew</u> for minors year round. Persons under the age of 18 must be off the street by
 11:00pm each evening. While we pride ourselves on being a family-friendly destination, in the late evening hours,
 most businesses cater to crowds 21 and over. For the safety of our younger visitors, parents should ensure their
 children are at their home or rental by 11:00pm.
- The Dewey Beach Police will be out and about throughout New Years Eve and New Years Day. We're here to keep you safe! If you see suspicious behavior or require assistance, please call 911 or alert an officer directly.
- As always, while you're here, you're a member of the Dewey Beach family. Look out for one another. If you notice
 a person that may require assistance, confront them, and ask if they need help. Recruit support from business
 employees or police when necessary.


