TOWN MANAGER'S

Spolate

Some say fall at the beach is the best time of year, and I would agree with that! The ocean is still warm, school is back in session, the crowds have thinned, and free parking is in effect. We have so many fall activities in Dewey Beach in October, from Dewey Goes Pink, Greyhounds Reach the Beach, and Trick or Treat/Haunted Dance Party to name a few. They are all highlighted in this month's newsletter.

Here are some updates and reminders:

DelDOT has scheduled the repaving of all state-owned streets in Dewey Beach at the end of October. They will start in the north end of town and work their way south. The repaving includes milling the old street, leveling, and repaving. Once completed, the Town will need to paint all fire hydrant areas, handicap parking spots, and driveway markings. When the Town receives the start date, we will provide a phone number and email address for DelDOT's contractor should you have any questions.

If you have a building project and you're not sure if you need a Dewey Beach Building Permit, please go to our town webpage under property owners and click on <u>building permit applications</u>. More than half of the town is in a special flood zone, and work on your property, especially in this area, needs a permit.

The Town Hall building is moving along. The first-floor walls are up, and the pouring of the second floor should be this week. Hopefully we'll have the roof on around Thanksgiving.

In the Town right-of-way, please do not put landscaping, trees, bushes, or signs of any kind without preapproval from the town. Items in the town right of way will be removed.


This summer marked the first season under the new ordinance prohibiting tents and unaccompanied canopies on the beach before 9 a.m. As with any new regulation, there is a learning curve. To help educate the public, the Town installed signs at every dune crossing and our lifeguards distributed informational cards. During the early part of each week between 8 and 9 a.m., unaccompanied canopies were tagged with warning notices to remind beachgoers of the ordinance. On average, about five tags were issued weekly from Chesapeake Street to Collins Avenue. Later in the week, the number of unaccompanied canopies dropped noticeably, averaging only one or two. Overall, for the first summer with this new policy, compliance was very encouraging. The canopy ordinance is expected to be discussed again at the October Commissioners' Meeting, and public comments are welcome.

On Saturday, November 1st from 4pm to 6:30pm in the Sunset Room at the Hyatt, the Dewey Beach Civic League and the Town of Dewey Beach will present "<u>A DEWEY HISTORY EVENT - 1962 to Present</u>" with cash bar and snacks. This will be an informative and engaging event, featuring presentations from Dewey Beach locals sharing stories and memorable moments from our town's history. Seats are limited, so arrive early!

If you're planning to complete work on your property this fall, file your permit application today to ensure you receive your permit before work begins.



Property Watch

Are you planning to be out of town for the off-season? Make sure we have up-to-date contact information by submitting a <u>Property Watch form</u>. If we're alerted to any issues related to your home, such as water leaks, storm damage, or suspicious activity, we'll be sure to contact you.



Did you rent your property between April 1st and September 30th? Your accommodations tax payment is due by October 15th!

The accommodations tax rate is 3% of your gross proceeds derived from your rental.






